Dear Parents and Carers,

Visit to the Roman Amphitheatre, Baths and Museum in Caerleon in Wales.

On the 19th October, a visit has been arranged for Class 4 to visit the Roman Amphitheatre, Baths and Museum in Caerleon. This will enable the class to see Roman ruins and artefacts related to our Term 1 history topic 'Romans in British History'. We will investigate day to day aspects of Roman life and meet workshop hosts who will teach the children about life as a child in Roman Britain.

We have managed to reduce the cost, from £15 last year to £13.69 per head, which covers the cost of transport, the workshop and guide for the day. We would be grateful if you could complete the permission slip and pay the £13.69 contribution, via Parent Pay, by 2nd October 2026. As a school we rely on the contributions to cover the cost of the trip. If we do not receive sufficient funds, the trip may need to be cancelled.

A packed lunch is required, with a drink in a refillable container. No fizzy drinks, cans or glass bottles, please. Children should wear their school uniform, and have a warm and waterproof coat, with a hood, along with sturdy shoes (trainers/walking boots will be allowed on this occasion).

To get the most out of the day, we will need to leave school promptly at **8:40am**. We would therefore be grateful if children, on the 19th October, could arrive at school at **8:25am**, ready for a prompt departure. Please come to the main school entrance. We appreciate that this is earlier than the usual school start, but the fantastic learning opportunities at the venue will be incredibly enriching and provide an outstanding learning experience. We aim to return for the end of the school day, traffic permitting.

We anticipate one further trip in the spring term to support our learning in science. We are currently considering either WWT Slimbridge or Westhay Moor National Nature Reserve. Further details, including any cost, will follow nearer the time.

We will take school medicines and inhalers with us on the day, please inform us if any additional medicines that may need to be taken.

As with all trips, parents are reminded that if they wish to consider insurance cover for their children, they are advised to make their own arrangements.
